PASTOR CHATTER

On the Sundays in Advent we've been thinking together about the themes of "The Advent Conspiracy" (adventconspiracy.org). This "conspiracy" began in 2006 when five pastors imagined a better Christmas practice for their faith communities.

The question they raise is this. "Can Christmas still change the world?" How did the best story in the world turn into stuff, stress, and debt? The Advent Conspiracy is now a global movement of Christians and congregations who seek to resist the Christmas narrative that is focused on consumption. These Christians CONSPIRE to change the way we celebrate Christmas, and to invite the world into a better Christmas story! The Advent Conspiracy challenges us in four ways.

To WORSHIP FULLY – putting down our burdens and lifting a song up to God.

To SPEND LESS – being more realistic about our gift-giving, thus freeing ourselves from the anxiety of debt.

To GIVE MORE – remembering that the most powerful, memorable gift you can offer is yourself.

To LOVE ALL – freeing up our resources to love as Jesus loves by giving to those who really need help.

The Advent Conspiracy is a perfect follow up to our series on LOVING GENEROUSLY. Remember that it is not enough to say NO to the way others are celebrating Christmas. We must also say YES to a different way of celebrating!
