REMEMBER that during the summer, our giving can sometimes fluctuate. Even if you are out of town for a bit, please remember that your consistent weekly and monthly giving can help us stay on track toward our mission and ministries!

YOUR GIVING HAS RESULTS! Our 2017 general budget is \$124,048. So we need around \$10,337 monthly to fully fund our ministries. Part of that supports UMC apportionments – "a portion" of each offering "meant" for the work of Christ around the world.

Please remember that your regular generous support enables the whole work of Christ's church to remain strong.

ALTA MONS is one of our most "local" items. The work and ministry of historic Camp Alta Mons (between Salem and Christiansburg, near Shawsville) is supported by the 70 UM churches in the Roanoke area. Alta Mons is best known for its summer camping ministry, but there are year-round ministry, retreat, camping and recreational opportunities, too! If you have never seen the beauty of Camp Alta Mons, you will want to be a part of the areawide celebration and picnic on Saturday, August 26. This year celebrates the 60th anniversary of Alta Mons, or you might be interested in the Family Square Dance at Alta Mons on October 14!

Our monthly apportionment share is \$162. This is pooled with our neighbor churches to support this sacred place! Remember, Alta Mons is open to the public every day from sunrise to sunset except during summer camp (June 25 to July 21). During that time you may hike on Saturdays or Sundays before 2:00 p.m. If you plan to hike during late June or July, it is best to call the office before driving to Alta Mons to make sure they are open for hiking.
