PASTOR CHATTER

It's conference season for United Methodists, and for many of us this serves as a great "family reunion." Some of you realize that I actually have two conferences and two bishops. I serve as a pastor in the Virginia Conference but my home membership remains in the Texas Conference. Both of these conferences welcomed new bishops in the past year — Bishop Scott Jones in Texas, and Bishop Sharma Lewis in Virginia.

My roots in United Methodism sink very deep. Beginning July 9, I want us to spend some time thinking together about what I call "Good Roots!" Our Sunday messages will look at some of the unique distinctives about our faith tradition, and how those strong beliefs are so helpful to vital life in Christ!

I'll also be offering an evening class that will look at some of the popular teachers, preachers and writers of our day and time – many of whom are considered "non-denominational." Though I will make every effort to be respectful and fair, it will be important for us to understand some of the differences between our faith approach and theirs. You'll be hearing more about both of these series.

And one more thing, to be honest, these are pretty difficult times for many church groups, and United Methodists are no exception. An international team is working hard to help provide direction amid serious differences of opinion about current issues. I will be offering a one-session overview on Wednesday evening, June 28. (See related article.) If you are interested in knowing more about these efforts, I hope to see you then!

- **1 comb**: Comb needs to be sturdy and longer

than 6 inches long;

- 1 metal nail file or nail clippers
- **1 bath-size soap:** 3oz. and larger sizes only; No Ivory or Jergens soap due to moisture content;

Financial contributions are also needed.

We need to send \$1.00 to purchase toothpaste and \$1.00 for shipping. *UMCOR is now purchasing toothpaste in bulk to be added to health kits before shipping to ensure that the product does not expire before they are sent.
