**YOUR GIVING HAS RESULTS!** Our 2017 general budget is \$124,048. So we need around \$10,337 monthly to fully fund our ministries. Part of that supports UMC apportionments – "a portion" of each offering "meant" for the work of Christ around the world.

WORLD SERVICE is one of the best known funds that is a part of our United Methodist heritage. Our church family contributes about \$43 a week for World Service. But where does it go? As you might guess, this fund goes "around the world" for missionaries, evangelism, new churches, anti-hunger projects, advocacy for justice, and local church resources for work with children, youth, singles, students, disabled persons, and adults of all ages. "A portion" of every offering you make literally travels across the globe! Thank you for the part you play!

#### PASTOR CHATTER

On April 30, I shared some thoughts about the difference between "cessationists" and "continuationists." This is not an issue I had ever explored very deeply. There are a few Christian groups that believe that the Book of Acts shows us a distinct time in the early church in which "signs, wonders and miracles" were frequent, and that this time is over. It has ceased. These are the cessationists!

There are also some that believe that "signs, wonders and miracles" are to be expected on a regular basis today. That the extraordinary stories in the Book of Acts are not extraordinary at all. These are the continuationists!

As I noted in that message, United Methodist do not really fall into either "camp," and our views are not extreme in either direction. However, we clearly do NOT have a doctrine of cessation. Nowhere do we teach that the Holy Spirit worked one way in the Book of Acts and that some of those gifts of the Spirit have been retired.

Signs, wonders and miracles may not be commonplace. If they were too common, they wouldn't get our attention! But in my not-so-humble view, we are to be deeply open to the powerful moving of God's Spirit in mighty ways....even today....even in OUR church!

Don't read the Book of Acts and just be excited about what God did "back in the day." Read the Book of Acts and then pray for God to move in mighty ways right here and right now!

PASTOR SIGHTINGS - Every active United Methodist ordained pastor is expected to fulfill regular expectations for continuing education and spiritual renewal.
