OUR PRAYERS, SERVICE AND WITNESS - Thank you for your daily prayers for our ministry, for sharing your prayer requests and praise reports, for giving of your time, energy and talents, and for making a positive witness for Christ and his church!

YOU MADE IT HAPPEN - One of our "close to home" missions is the Wesley Foundation at Virginia Tech. This campus ministry is an outreach to students at VT on behalf of Christ and The United Methodist Church. Wesley at VT takes many forms. "Communities of Grace" offer small group experiences at multiple times throughout the week. Weekly worship takes place on Wednesday evening. (Sunday mornings are times of worship at area congregations.) A fall retreat is offered in October at a very low cost. Wesley even has a food pantry for college students who are struggling financially. Then in the spring, Wesley provides the leadership for an annual low-cost weekend retreat for area middle school and high school groups. Our own kids have participated the last few years!

MPUMC directly supports the Wesley Foundation at Tech through our budget. The amount for 2016 is small. Only \$114 is asked from us annually as our share. So keep VT Wesley in your thoughts and prayers, and perhaps there will be a time when we can offer a special blessing beyond this small annual amount! That's a lot of bang for our buck!

PASTOR CHATTER

I wonder what songs they sang during the first year of worship in Mount Pleasant back in 1841. You might be surprised that few, if any, of your favorites were likely on the list. Why might that be? The answer is simple.

Although many people claim to like the "old songs," most of the ones we call "old" are actually relatively new. Almost all of our "old time" favorites had not yet been written in 1841. Hard to believe, isn't it!

A recent survey uncovered the top ten favorite hymns of United Methodist people. Only one of those top ten songs was in existence with both words and melody as of 1841, and that was Martin Luther's strong hymn, "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God." We won't quibble about the fact that the popular English translation of this German hymn came along in 1853, because other English forms of this song go back as far as 1539! But truly, if they sang that song in 1841, the words may have been a bit different.

The other real oldie on the list was John Newton's "Amazing Grace." Though the words of his hymn go back to 1779, it was first published with the familiar tune in 1847, just six years after the founding of our church! So if they sang "Amazing Grace" in 1841, we would not have recognized the melody!

I guess this goes to show you that we are better at learning new songs than we might think. That's good, because God's Word does instruct several times in the Psalms to "sing unto the Lord a new song!"

Don't you just love the singing that is a part of our heritage? By the way, the other eight songs on the list were How Great Thou Art, Here I Am Lord, Because He Lives, Blessed Assurance, Be Thou My Vision, It Is Well With My Soul, Hymn of Promise, and In the Garden!

Second, I needed to let you know that we have switched around a few of the items starting in October. Our church will now be providing the *Beanee-Weenees (individual servings)*, the small boxes of cereal and the Mac & Cheese! Remember you can donate these items or make a monetary donation. If you use a check, please note on it that it is for the Backpack Program.

The cost of these items for **one child** is \$2.02 a week or \$8.08 for a month. We are now serving 48 children! There is a real need!
