THE DECEMBER SPECIAL OFFERING amounted to \$4,532 as of 12/31. Thank you so much!! This helps us to finish the year in a strong way. (It is included in the budget offering total above.)

YOUR GIVING HAS RESULTS! Part of our monthly budget supports UMC apportionments – "a portion" of each offering "meant" for the work of Christ around the world. If you were to look at the list you might be baffled by an item called "PRE-1982 PENSION LIABILITY ASSESSMENT." What on earth is that? Let's try to simplify!

Before 1982, UMC retired pastors received their monthly pensions but there was no money set aside for it. The money had to be raised each year. In 1982, the UMC moved to a fully funded pension. That was a tough but wise decision. Since that time, churches have paid a set amount each month to support their pastor's pension. (Pastor Robert says THANK YOU!!!)

However, we are still supporting pensions for retired pastors and their surviving spouses for years they served prior to 1982. This line item provides funding for these pre-1982 years. So many retired pastors and surviving spouses count on this support! For 2018, our budget provides approximately \$63 monthly for this cause.

The Church Family Meeting on January 28 will show how this affects our finances and ministry. Do remember that pastor appointments are reviewed EVERY YEAR – regardless of this budget decision. These reviews and decisions are made by Bishop Lewis through late spring. This is still the standard procedure every year for all the UMCs in Virginia.

<u>THE "52" GOAL</u>. I almost gulped when I shared this goal last week. It's exciting to see new folks on our list of attenders. Some Sundays as many as half of our attenders have no "official" connection to the church family. (They are no longer "guests," but not yet members!) We had several new members and baptisms in 2016, my report for 2017 does not show fruit in that area. 2018 can be a year in which we reclaim our shared call to baptize and make disciples! Please pray with me that 2018 will be a year with much fruit!

THE GOSPEL OF JOHN. Up until Easter we have 17 weeks with the Gospel of John on Sunday mornings. John's gospel offers a unique perspective on Jesus' life and ministry. Starting January 28, we have five weeks on a series from John called "TURNAROUNDS" - looking at five stories of how God's power helped turned lives around.

ELIJAH, 21ST JUNE 1993, JOSHUA, 23 JANUARY 1995, MERCY, 17 FEBRUARY 2000 - These children are brothers and sister. They lost their father during a very heavy rain fall in the middle of the night when they were all asleep.
