YOUR GIVING HAS RESULTS!

Part of our monthly budget supports UMC apportionments - "a portion" of each offering "meant" for the work of Christ around the world. This month we highlight one of these line items - the "EPISCOPAL FUND." You may wonder what this even means. Simply put - the word "episcopal" means "referring to church bishops," and this fund helps provide the support for the work of the bishops of the United Methodist Church. There are 46 active bishops in the U.S., and 20 additional bishops who serve around the world in other countries. Retired bishops no longer have a "service area," but they continue to serve as part of the Council of Bishops. Bishop Sharma D. Lewis has led the Virginia Conference since 2016. Each pastor can trace back their ordination through the authority of bishops in Methodist tradition. Pastor Robert was ordained in 1978 by Bishop Crutchfield, who was only four steps removed from ordination by Bishop Francis Asbury, one of the first two U.S. Methodist bishops! Small world!
