#### YOUR GIVING HAS RESULTS!

Part of our giving supports UMC apportionments - "a portion" of each offering "meant" for the work of Christ around the world. This month we highlight the BLACK COLLEGE FUND (about \$26 a month for our church's share). Our offerings for BCF support the 11 United Methodist historically black colleges and universities in the U.S., including one medical school. These schools provide opportunities for many students of promise who otherwise might be excluded from higher education. Graduates of these institutions — teachers, doctors, ministers, bishops, judges, artists and entrepreneurs — are leaders in the African-American community and in a rapidly changing, more diverse United States. The closest BCF school to us is Bennett College in Greensboro.

#### THANKS FROM PASTOR ABRAHAM IN GHANA!

We believe that the Lord will reward you in so many ways you will not understand. You are such a wonderful people. You have been with us for so many years helping us to help these needy children. In Phil. 4 Paul said that giving helps us to credit our account. We might not know how God disburses the blessings. What we know is that he is faithful and just to do what he said. If not for your support, these children would not have shelter, food, education etc. As I said in my previous letter, the Lord has blessed us with land and we are doing the best we can to put up a house so that we stop the problem of rent. For so many years, we had it in mind to provide a Learning Centre for the children, providing books, evening tuition, computer access, etc. Some were asked to go home because they do not have footwear, uniform etc. We are here on a mission but each has his or her own vision. Paul was on a mission on earth but he did not know his vision until he met Christ on his way to Damascus. We as individual Christians have our role and mission to accomplish. It is very important to recognize this to fulfill God's vision. "We are his co-workers (1 Cor. 6:1-2)." That is why we are unique and special. Thank you all givers, and may the Lord bless you. Amen.
