200 years ago, on Dec. 24, 1818, "Silent Night" made its debut at a chapel in Austria. The melody by Franz Gruber is instantly recognizable. The original German text is now found in over 140 languages. In 1914, soldiers in World War I held a cease fire and sang Christmas carols, including "Silent Night." The song is sung around the world during the lighting of candles in churches on Christmas Eve.

# 2019 budget approved

Our Finance Committee and Church Council have approved the 2019 budget, and copies are available for any interested person. Some of our ministries (including the youth ministry position) continue to be funded through the special Barton gift.

The regular budget for 2019 has been set at \$105,915. This is a decrease of about 9 percent from 2018. This budget covers the basic ministries, outreach and upkeep of the work of our church. It depends on the giving of each participant, young and old!

About a year ago, we approved a plan to gradually decrease our budget year by year between 2017 and 2021 while keeping our ministries strong. Your prayers and support are necessary to make this happen! If you have questions about the church budget, please ask – it can be very confusing – so please ask!
