It was a blast to be able to attend my 45th high school reunion in

Newton, Texas. Along with seeing lots of friends, I was invited to bring the Sunday message at the church that was my home congregation during high school.



Newton is a small town (population 2,478) located in the "piney woods" of East Texas,

just a few miles away from the Louisiana border. It lies in the easternmost county in Texas! For my message at Newton I noted that Luke's version of the "beatitudes" is quite different from Matthew's version. In addition to the blessings, Jesus also shares the woes. You might be surprised who gets the woes: *Woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation. Woe to you who are full now, for you will be hungry. Woe to you who are laughing now, for you will mourn and weep. Woe to you when all speak well of you, for that is what their ancestors did to the false prophets. (Luke 6:24-26)* 

It occurred to me that Jesus' "woe pronouncements" are the very things we tend to take pride in or be thankful for. As Thanksgiving approaches, be sure to go deep into the Jesus way of thinking about life. You might see blessings in a whole new way. Read the blessings in Luke 6:20-23!
