## What does the Advent wreath mean?

The Advent wreath was once a Scandinavian and German home custom, marking Advent week by week. Families would light a candle for each passing week at mealtime or evening prayer. The candles could be any color, and they might be in a circle or a straight line.

Most importantly, as December grew darker, the Advent light grew brighter!

Churches began to use Advent wreaths in the late 19th century. Church candles were larger than home candles, and colors of purple

or blue became most common to coordinate with the Advent fabric colors. Ceremonies were developed around the lighting of candles each week. Even later, weekly themes of hope, peace, joy and love were added by some. But the historic theme of Advent is more broad and deep than any one-word theme can capture.

We may still draw meaning from its original home use – marking time while light increases. The "Christian Year" begins with Advent, and it is all about time. We await the day when the holy city needs no sun or moon, because God's glory is its light (Rev. 21:23). We prepare for the promise that in Christ, "the true light that shines on all people was coming into the world" (John 1:9).

## 2020 budget approved

Our new 2020 church budget was approved, and copies are available for anyone interested! The total budget of \$129,076 includes items funded by the Barton gift. This is a decrease of \$4,621 compared to 2019. The amount needed from our general offerings is about \$8,805 per month, again a small decrease compared to 2019. The decrease was made possible by a smaller apportionment for district and conference projects.

Since 2017 we have made a few adjustments to our budgeting that enable us to live within our means, and we are very grateful for each one whose faithful giving allows our work to go forward. Lives are touched and changed because of your gifts!

## Christmas Eve outreach projects

As we spend December thinking about how God used mothers and children to transform the world, our Christmas Eve outreach

projects will focus on mothers and children. Our local project is the Blue Ridge Women's Center on Williamson Road, offering a medical clinic specializing in unplanned pregnancy, relationships, and reproductive health. The center is dedicated to improving the well being of women and their families. Quality care is provided at no cost to their clients.

Our global project is Babyfold, an UMCOR project that is part of the Old Mutare Fairfield

Children's Home in Zimbabwe. Babyfold cares for abandoned and other vulnerable children, giving them a homelike environment. Offerings help provide baby formula, health care, education, and house parents. The Old Mutare Mission is located adjacent to Africa University, and was established in 1897 by Bishop Joseph C. Hartzell.

This is one of those years when Advent begins on the first day of December. (The date varies each year based on when Christmas falls, and it can begin in November or December.)

Advent presents constant challenges to pastors and worship leaders. While the rest of our culture is "making merry" seven days a week, our church traditions call us to slow down and reflect. Admittedly, it is hard to be spiritually reflective while munching fruitcake and sipping eggnog.

I resolve not to be one of those cranky pastors who whine too much about this. But I do try to make sure that our Sunday worship honors the true spirit of Advent. Many Christians are surprised to learn that the traditional focus of Advent includes an emphasis on the Second Coming of Jesus. This is the time of year to assess our readiness for his return!

For 2019 we're doing a series I've never used before – four "birth stories" in the Bible, along with the mothers involved – Jochebed and her son Moses, Mrs. Manoah and her son Samson, Elizabeth and her son John, and Mary and her son Jesus. Keep your eyes open to the connections in these stories of our faith!
