From Pastor Robert ...

At this moment, we are in the beautiful state of Florida. We've been spending a lot of time outdoors. We traveled along a highway in southern Florida called the Tamiami Trail. It was called this because it was designed in the 1920's to connect Tampa and Miami.

An amazing amount of effort went into the construction of the Tamiami Trail, particularly the very southern part of the highway where it diverts away from the Gulf Coast and eastward toward Miami. It was completed in 1928.

If you know anything about this part of Florida, this was not prime territory for the building of a highway! These are the Everglades where there is a literal "river of grass." The builders had to use explosives to create a huge canal, and then build up the land to create a road.

Sadly, this wonderful new highway had a devastating effect on the Everglades. It literally had a damming effect upon the ecology of southern Florida.

Twelve years ago, in 2009, a new effort began to partially undo the damage of Tamiami. Sections of the old highway have been replaced with elevated roadway, permitting the water flow to begin again.

The lesson of the Tamiami Trail is that rebuilding is possible. We can restore the flow of God's life-giving water. But it does take time and effort.

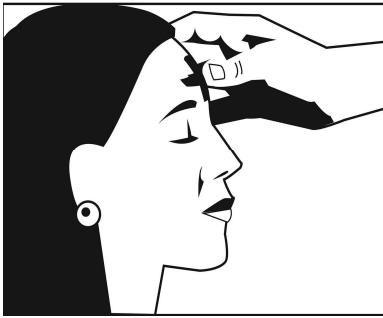
Community Outreach

Ash Wednesday

Lent Begins March 2



Lent begins on March 2 with a brief in-person Ash Wednesday worship service at two different times on that date - 12 noon and 7 p.m. We'll also have "drive-by" ashes in the back parking lot between 6 and 6:45 p.m. for anyone who prefers to avoid a group setting.

The imposition of a small mark of ash on the forehead lifts up two special themes. First, we are reminded of our mortality ("ashes to ashes, dust to dust"). Second, we are reminded of the call to repentance.

This year during Lent we will focus on Jesus' sermon on the mount (chapters 5-7 of Matthew). Since Lent is only a month away, now is a good time to begin thinking about disciplines you will want to include during Lent. Our worship during February will help us prepare for Lent.



We have already had one Sunday cancelled with reduced attendance. Hopefully that is behind us, but in case of inclement weather, remember to check Channel 7 or 10 (TV or online) for weather closing info.

Note that there are several Mt. Pleasant UMC's in the area! We make every effort to be open, but PLEASE use good sense and discretion. Our road may be open, but yours may not be. Remember that even if in-person worship is cancelled, we will still share our worship video on YouTube.

PRAYER SCHOOL STARTS FEB. 27

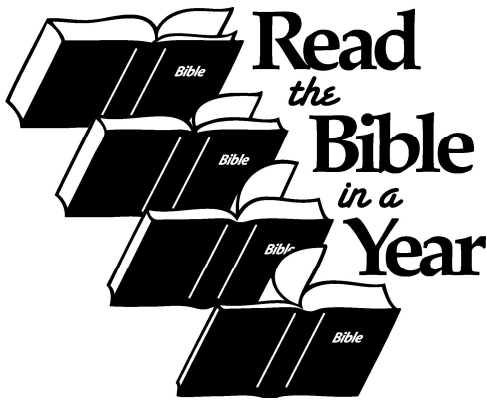
