From Pastor Robert ...

Just before the beginning of Lent I participated in a three-evening "prayer school" led by Brian Zahnd, a pastor in Missouri. He challenged us to continue in a daily prayer liturgy, and to go at least through Easter. There were a few bumps along the way, but most days I was able to complete the liturgy. It takes 20-30 minutes a day for the full experience!

One of the biggest challenges has been the part of the liturgy called "Sitting With Jesus," a special time of contemplation. This is a time that goes beyond words. Honestly, I am still working on this.

I went back and reviewed my notes from the prayer school. Zahnd suggested that this was a time when he would slip into silence, and really not try to think of anything. Now that is a challenge for me.

Zahnd said this was the most significant part of his prayer time. It is the time when he comes the closest to direct interaction with Christ, even though it is wordless. Zahnd says that whenever his mind would wander, he would offer a bare whisper - "Jesus." And that would bring him back.

I'll try to stay with it. I'll let you know how it goes!

Our United Methodist Women are assembling Hygiene kits this month. UMCOR Hygiene Kits provide basic necessities to people who have been forced to leave their homes because of human conflict or natural disaster.

The kit includes:

- One hand towel (15 x 25 –17 x 27 inches) No kitchen, cleaning, or microfiber towels
- One washcloth
 No kitchen, cleaning, or microfiber towels
- One comb
 - Must be sturdy with at least 6 inches of teeth. No pocket combs or picks. Rattail and combs without handles are acceptable but must have at least 6 inches of teeth
- One toenail or fingernail clipper No emery boards or metal nail files
- Bath-size soap (3 oz. bar or larger) No Ivory or Jergen's soap. Do not remove from packaging
- One adult toothbrush Do not remove from packaging.
- 10 adhesive bandages (3/4 by 3 inches)

The assembled kits will be sent to Annual Conference being held in Hampton, VA June 16-18.

Each kit is valued at \$12. How can you help?

- Collect items to complete a kit.
- Collect individual items that will be used to complete a kit (You do not need to purchase all items for a kit; instead, you can purchase and donate just individual items)
- Make a financial contribution and the UMW will do the shopping for you.
- Make a financial contribution to cover shipping costs (\$2.00 per kit)


