THIS YEAR'S CHURCH CONFERENCE

All are invited to this year's Church Conference, to be held immediately after worship on Sunday, October 30. This provides an overview of where we have been and where we are going, and includes the election of officers for the coming year, along with setting the pastor compensation package for 2023. Don't miss it.

FINDING WORSHIP ONLINE

Our video version of worship is now distributed on Sunday morning for your convenience. It is a shorter version of the day's music and message. We seem to be having more viewers by posting it earlier in the day.

How do I find MPUMC worship online? Glad you asked! The fastest way is to go to our Facebook page. Newest posts are found at the top. Just scroll down to locate the worship video. You do NOT have to be a Facebook user to find our page! Remember that there are a lot of Mount Pleasant churches! If you have trouble, try typing in MPUMCROANOKE. You can also try entering facebook.com/mpumcroanoke.

You might prefer to go directly to YouTube on your cell phone or computer. After you get to YouTube, just type in "Mount Pleasant United Methodist Church Roanoke" and it should pop up! If you are logged in to YouTube, go ahead and hit "SUBSCRIBE." This will make it easier to find next time. Another way to find our YouTube page is to enter https://tinyurl.com/2wvv8td7. That should work for you!

Remember that worship services from previous weeks are found on both the Facebook page and the YouTube page. Occasionally there is additional devotional content, especially on Facebook.

We have now discontinued our "Sermon by Phone" service. Most weeks, our number of calls had dropped to zero. If you would like to hear or watch the worship service, but do not have access to the Internet, one way is to watch or listen with a friend who has access to a phone or computer! You might even get them interested!

Remember also that you can make your offering online. If you can't be present, you can drop your check in the mail! If it is a gift for a special purpose, be sure to mark your check. If it is more convenient, just use the link for online giving. The Virginia Conference makes this available to us.

Go to vaumcdonations.org - then to "Local Church Online Giving." To be sure you get it to the right church, enter our GCFA number - 482808 - and enter Roanoke, Mount Pleasant, and the amount. Gifts online will not show on a MPUMC giving statement as they are recorded as gifts through the conference. They are tax deductible, and you should receive an acknowledgement. Let us know if you have any questions about that!

"For you will go out in Joy and be led back in peace; the mountains and hills before you Shall burst into song, and all the trees of the field shall clap their hands!"







Their safe environment is a refuge for those in need where they can receive toiletries, clothing, and other necessities. They offer laundry services and a safe place to store their possessions for the day. Guests in the shelter can sign up to work through a day labor program which allows them to earn a small income. 
