WORDS FROM PASTOR ROBERT:

As I write, it is still 24 days until the beginning of Lent. Ash Wednesday 2023 falls on Feb. 22. That begins forty weekdays of Lenten observance (plus six Sundays) until Easter on April 9.

Some people adopt special disciplines during Lent. So NOW is the time to prepare. Some choose an indulgence to give up. Others find spiritual disciplines to add. Upcoming sermons in the FROM ONE TO TEN series will help you.

Sometimes it is hard to think about adding or subtracting something for forty days. Let me challenge you to think about a "one time a day" discipline.

Every morning during Lent, try praying the "SHOW ME PRAYER." I can't remember where I first heard about it, but it goes something like this:

"Dear Lord, just for today please SHOW ME one special way in which I can share light and love to someone. SHOW ME one thing I need to stop doing or saying. And SHOW ME one special thing that I can learn about you."

If you will keep a SHOW ME list during these forty days of Lent, it will help you learn so much about how the Lord is leading you in your faith journey!

Did you know ... "Mardi Gras" is a French term which translates in English to "Fat Tuesday?" It reflects the practice of the last night of eating rich, fatty foods before the ritual sacrifices and fasting of the Lenten season. In the Christian Church it is referred to as "Shrove Tuesday" and is the last day of the Christian liturgical season. It is often celebrated in churches at Pancake Breakfasts (symbolizing the final eating of our richer, fatter foods before we fast). Also on Shrove Tuesday churches will burn the palms used during the previous year's Palm Sunday to make the ashes for their Ash Wednesday service.

Come join us for our Mardi Gras Potluck on Sunday, February 19th following our worship service. There's sure to be lots of rich, fatty food (and of course, some good healthy choices). Wonder if anyone will bring pancakes?
